The budgets proposed by the committee chairs were M/S/P/

At its meeting on October 23, 2022, the Committee again reiterated its previous decision to put aside two years of operating expenses before allocating any monies towards the committees' proposed sixmonth budgets. As annual operating expenses, a combination of administrative and program expenses, totals approximately \$40,000 p.a., the amount of \$80,000 was put aside for operating expenses. When that amount was deduced from \$153,594, a combination of monies in the checking and savings accounts, \$73,594 was available for the committees' next six months budgets.

The Board authorized Ritz to move \$2,500 from the checking account to the Capital Campaign Special Reserves Account for TRT advanced training.

She was also authorized to move \$1,000 from the checking account into the Capital Campaign Special Reserves Account for unexpected vehicle maintenance.

Finally, she was authorized to move \$20,000 from the checking account to the High Yield Money Market Savings Account.

- Swiftwater Safety Institute will be holding a 2day Swiftwater class in North Bend April 2023.

- He is working on an Operating Procedures
 Manual and hopes to have it completed within
 the next 12 months.

Unfinished Business:

New Truck Research

Rory and Greta have been discussing the features we need. After looking at several brands the best one for our needs would be a Ford Transit Van, preferably an F350 HP that has a towing capacity of 6600 lbs.. Availability is very limited right now – Rory is thinking if we wait until between Christmas and the New Year we will have the best chance of negotiating pricing. He estimates the vehicle to cost between \$55K - \$75K.

He said attaching a winch to the vehicle would be counter productive as it would be necessary, and expensive, to upgrade the front end and suspension. However, a tow ring would be attached.

We are paying for this truck with a grant we received from the Gary E Milgard Family Foundation/Ruth Foundation of \$59,056.00, along with an estimated \$13,000 from the sale of our 2006 Ford F250 and \$10,000 from WASART donations.

Disposition of Grant from WSAVT

An REI Group was very impressed with a rescue we did on Dirty Harry's Balcony and one of the members is with Washington State Association of Veterinary Technicians and wanted to donate \$1500 to the TRT.

Jeff gave them a list of TRT equipment needed and they offered to donate \$450 towards that equipment, \$500 for training scholarships and \$500 towards volunteer expenses.

They would like a social media post of them presenting the equipment to us.

As Jeff had already purchased the equipment on the list provided to WSAVT, the Board discussed various options for allocating the \$1,500. It was finally decided that an explanation and new list of proposed equipment purchases would be emailed to the prospective donors with the suggestion that the \$500 training scholarships be applied towards a contemplated advanced training by Rigging for Rescue and the \$500 for expenses be utilized for training and deployment equipment and clothing assistance.

Gretchen will email WSAVT with the Board's recommendations.

Advising Specialist

We currently only have one advising specialist, Julie Shipman, so Bill suggested we appoint Jennifer O'Neal to the position of Advising Specialist because of her expertise in AV and her generosity in sharing her knowledge, expertise, and facilities so many times for WASART's benefit.
